### Stockholm Centre for Commercial Law Scholarships at the Law Faculty of the University of Stockholm

These scholarships, funded through the generosity of the Stockholm Centre for Commercial Law (SCCL) provide for up to 30,000 Swedish Krona for one or two researchers from Oxford to do research at SCCL for a period of up to four months in total. Either one scholarship for the total amount, or two scholarships for half the amount will be awarded, so long as only one Scholar is there at any one time. The Scholarships are open to doctoral research students in the Faculty of Law and, fixed-term or permanent College appoints in law, and members of the Law Faculty. Preference may be given to doctoral research students. There will be no teaching or other formal obligations and knowledge of the Swedish language is not required.

The timing of the visit is flexible but should take place before the end of the 2024-25 academic year (i.e., by the end of September 2025) and should generally be arranged with the Stockholm office as soon as possible upon notification of the scholarship, and the dates shared with the IECL Administrator immediately. If applicants are interested in attending lectures or seminars in Stockholm, the visit should coincide with their semester which runs from the beginning of January to mid-May. The Scholarship is intended to cover the costs of the visit (including travel and accommodation) as much as possible.

If you would like to apply for the SCCL Scholarship scheme during the **academic year 2024-25** you should complete this [form](#) by Friday of week 0 of Hilary term (**17 January 2025**). Applications should include, a (short) statement setting out your research project and indicating how a research visit to the University of Stockholm will contribute to the research project; and a curriculum vitae. In the case of graduate students, the support of the supervisor is necessary before the award can be made.
